Easter

Alleluia, Alleluia, He is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia, Alleluia.

Those words are the traditional Easter morning greeting among Christians. There are of course many other traditions connected with the festival. Some may be quite obvious, others more obscure.

Easter traditions and symbols have evolved over time, though some have been around for centuries. While to Christians, Easter is the celebration of the resurrection of Christ, many Easter traditions are not found in the Bible. The most prominent secular symbol of the Christian holiday, the Easter bunny, was reportedly introduced to America by the German immigrants who brought over their stories of an egg-laying hare. The decoration of eggs is believed to date back to at least the 13th century, while the rite of an Easter parade has even older roots.

The egg, an ancient symbol of new life, has been associated with pagan festivals celebrating spring. From a Christian perspective, Easter eggs are said to represent Jesus' emergence from the tomb and resurrection. Decorating eggs for Easter is a tradition that dates back to at least the 13th century, according to some sources. One explanation for this custom is that eggs were formerly a forbidden food during the Lenten season, so people would paint and decorate them to mark the end of the period of penance and fasting, then eat them on Easter as a celebration.

Lamb is a traditional Easter food. Christians refer to Jesus as the "Lamb of God," though lamb at Easter also has roots in early Passover celebrations. In the story of Exodus, the people of Egypt suffered a series of terrible plagues, including the death of all firstborn sons. Members of the Jewish faith painted their doorposts with sacrificed lamb's blood so that God would "pass over" their homes. Jews who converted to Christianity continued the tradition of eating lamb at Easter. Historically, lamb would have been one of the first fresh meats available after a long winter with no livestock to slaughter.

White Easter Lilies symbolize the purity of Christ and are common decorations in churches and homes around the Easter holiday. Their growth from dormant bulbs in the ground to flowers symbolize the rebirth and hope of Christ's resurrection. Lilies are native to Japan and were brought to England in 1777, then found their way to the U.S. following World War I.

As Christians, we celebrate Easter to worship our eternally perfect God who separated Himself from every other deity by choosing to give up His own rights and life to restore and save the rights and lives of His creation.

There is only one God who gives up what He deserves to give His creation what they don't. That's our God. He's why we celebrate Easter.

Easter represents the moment God's only Son, Jesus, took on our death sentence, served the term, and called it finished! (John 17:4, John 19:30) Because the same power (the Holy Spirit) that quaked the earth, that stole death from hell and made it life, that rolled away the stone, that pushed back darkness, is alive to do God's work in our hearts today. (Acts 4:33)

Alleluia, Alleluia, He is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia, Alleluia.

PLANNED GIVING THROUGH THE STANDING ORDER SCHEME

Some people have been asking how to make a donation to ASV.

Here are the details:

All Saints Vendée has had to change banks. I have written to everyone who contributes to the Planned Giving Scheme, asking them to change their virement (standing order). Please can anyone affected change their payments as soon as possible.

If anyone else would like to join the Planned Giving scheme, or to make a donation, please ask me for the details of the new banking arrangements. (mcgregor@lalogette.com)

ADVANTAGES:

<u>If you set up a standing order</u> (virement) through your French bank, online, it is cost-free.

<u>You stay in total control of what you give</u> – the standing order (virement) can be changed at any time, but only by you!

Only the Treasurer knows how much you give per month.

You know what you are giving, and exactly when the money comes out of your account, and so your budgeting is much easier.

If you complete a French tax form, then you will get a significant rebate (depending on your situation) at the end of each financial year.

If your French tax bill is small, then you will pay no tax at all!

ASV can plan ahead much more effectively, as it knows what contributions are coming in, rather than guessing who is going be at church!

DISADVANTAGES:

I can't think of any, so why not come and join the party!

If you do *not* have a French bank account, but would like to support the work of ASV, then please contact me, and I can help you. Please note, you cannot use tax-efficient giving in both France *and* the UK.

Mike writes:

RESTO DU COEUR is the chosen name for a Food Bank and Support Charity based in Coulonges-sur-l'Autize. The formal interpretation is a 'Soup Kitchen' which is a misnomer!

The Resto came to be "adopted" by All Saints Vendée through the tireless efforts of Bill and Carole Stocking going back to 2004. Bill set up a Collection Point for offerings at Puy de Serre on the second Sunday of every month which quickly grew into an integral part of our church life, which was gladly received by Resto.

Resto was set up in 2001 by a retired doctor in Coulonges. This was in response to growing concern at the number of Refugees homeless and unemployed in the town. This need has grown over the intervening years and at the time of writing stands at 63 clients. Needs have changed, the emphasis is now on non-perishable foods. Clothing has been banned because of Covid-19. There are less Refugees than before. I should stress that no client is accepted without a referral from an appropriate authority, e.g. Social Services, Church, another Charity, etc. The whole organisation is run by volunteers from the community, predominantly ladies. Personally, I find it inspirational to be associated with such devoted people who are all committed to the support of people who are in need. It is a sad reflection on our times that Resto du Coeur actually exists but these are difficult times and not likely to improve in the future.

All Saints Vendée has every right to be proud of what they have done since the start of our support. We have kept our support going over Lockdowns and the loss of Bill and Carole. We have supplemented our food support with financial aid, much of it initiated by Polly Ward. We have every intention of maintaining our generous aid, despite present day difficulties.

I make the monthly trip to Coulonges where I am always gladly received by the volunteers with appreciation of our help. Please keep your support going – it is a really positive thing to do. Please call me (02 51 51 07 36). If there are difficulties in collection, we can always arrange a solution! I would like to express my own thanks for your continued support.

REVISION OF THE ASV ELECTORAL ROLL

The Electoral Roll of a church is completely updated every six years - this was last done in 2019. Once updated, the Electoral Roll Officer is required to revise the Roll each year shortly before the Annual Meeting (AGM). The Council have now fixed the date for the AGM and it will take place at 11.45 on Zoom after the Zoom service on Sunday May 9th 2021. The revision has to be completed not later than 15 days before the AGM (i.e. April 24th.) and not earlier than 28 days before the AGM (i.e. April 11th.). Once it has been revised, the Roll is "frozen" until after the AGM has taken place.

If anyone wishes to join the ASV Electoral Roll, please complete an Application form and return it to me as soon as possible. An application form can be obtained from me or you can download the copy and notes found elsewhere in Grapevine. If anyone wishes to have their name removed from the Roll, please contact me. If you are on the Roll, and wish to remain on the Roll then there is nothing you need to do.

Only people on the Electoral Roll are allowed to nominate or stand for Churchwarden or a Council Member. Again only Roll members may attend the AGM and vote in elections or for motions at the AGM. In other words, membership of the Electoral Roll is the way to be able to take an active part in the life of the church. Notes. 1. Like many churches in France we enjoy active participation of people who spend part of their time back in the UK or elsewhere. Accordingly, we follow the advice of the Diocese in Europe and adopt a generous interpretation of the six month rule.

2. If you have any problem with this form, please approach any member of the Church Council who will be pleased to help you.

Notes to be read regarding the Electoral Roll Application Form

- 1. The only churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and certain foreign Churches.
- 2. Membership of the Electoral Roll is also open to members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare themselves to be members of the Church of England.
- 3. Every six years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can re-apply. If you are not resident but were on the roll as an habitual worshipper and have been prevented by sickness or absence or other essential reason from worshipping for the past six months, you may write "would" before "have habitually attended" on the form and add "but was prevented from doing so because" and then state the reason.
- 4. If you have any problems over this form, please approach the clergy or lay people responsible for the chaplaincy, who will be pleased to help you.

5Use of email addresses and other personal data is governed by local laws on Data Protection applying to the chaplaincy and by the Privacy Notice on the Chaplaincy's website.

6.The Diocese in Europe is subject to local laws in the host nation for the chaplaincy. Chaplaincy Governance is conducted under the Church Representation Rules as local laws and the Diocesan Constitution allow. Any necessary departures from the CRRs that have to apply in Europe are catered for in the Diocesan Constitution.

You do not have to provide an email address on this Form. If you do provide one, the Chaplaincy Council and the electoral roll officer are entitled to use that email address to communicate with you in connection with the maintenance or revision of the Roll or the preparation of a new Roll or with elections to or membership of the Council.

The Church Representation Rules impose certain requirements for your name and address to be given to a third party, such as the diocesan electoral registration officer, who may require it in connection with elections to or membership of a deanery synod, diocesan synod or the House of Laity of the General Synod. If you provide an email address on this Form, it will be given to the third party along with your postal address.

A third party to whom your name and address have been given under the Church Representation Rules is in certain cases required by the Rules to pass them on to another person, such as the presiding officer in a synodical election. If you provide an email address on this Form, that email address will be given to the other person along with your postal address.

Any person to whom your email address or other personal data is given under the Church Representation Rules is required by those Rules to hold the data securely. Furthermore, if you do provide an email address on this Form, that does not give anybody the right to use it for any purpose other than those permitted by the Rules; so it cannot, for example, be used for social matters or fund-raising. Those permissions have to be granted in a process other than Electoral Roll enrolment in accordance with the chaplaincy privacy policy.

The roll is published after each annual revision and after the preparation of a new roll. The published roll will include your name (as well as the name of every other person on the roll) but none of your other personal data (as defined by the Data Protection law in place) and will be made public as a result of your inclusion on the roll.

Please read MATTHEW Chapter4 verses 1-11.


