#### Welcome to November's Grapevine!

#### This month...

Hopefully you will receive this edition before the end of October, in which case don't forget to put your clocks and watches back an hour on the 25th, such that at 3.00 am on Sunday 26th, it will be 2.00 am.

The holy day of Toussaint (*All Saints' Day*) comes on the 1st of November and is followed by *All Souls' Day* on the second. Traditionally in France, *la Toussaint* is a time for family gatherings and the day after sees many people visiting the resting places of loved ones.

The supermarkets and florists' shops are full of crysanthemums (*les crysanthèmes*), which families place on the graves at this time of year. The significance of this flower is that, while it is unavoidably associated with loss, is in fact a very positive symbol, representing longevity and joy.

The name can be traced to the Greek words *chrusos* and *anthemys* meaning 'gold' and 'flower'.

November, in the UK, includes Guy Fawkes' Night on the 5th, involving fireworks and bonfires. On this night we celebrate the undoing of a 'traitor' who, with a group of Catholics led by Robert Catesby, plotted in 1605 to kill King James I of England and VI of Scotland by detonating vast quantities of gunpowder underneath the Houses of Parliament.

Democracy as we know it was still a long way off!

Another word associated with the beginning of November is 'halloween' (the vigil on the night before All Hallows Day – All Saints' Day).

## 4-thought Rev Hazel

Following the wedding of our grandson in October, we found ourselves with a few days of R & R time. Being based on the outskirts of my home town, we spent several hours driving round the Marine Drive, a road round the headland of the castle. It stands on a massive promontory of rock rising above the North Sea. Its 12th-century great tower is the centrepiece of a royal castle begun by Henry II. It became one of the greatest royal fortresses in England and figured prominently in national events during the Middle Ages. Its buildings are mostly relatively recent additions to a site which, as a natural fortress, has been intermittently inhabited and fortified for nearly 3,000 years.

We were amazed at how calm the sea was, watching surfers, and paddleboarders, being frustrated!

Later we ventured further north, crossing the moors to Whitby, and then passing the ruins of the Abbey and the church of St Mary. It will not come as a surprise to regular readers of Grapevine, that I like to list the Saints commemorated in the month, and the 19<sup>th</sup> is the day for St Hilda <u>Abbess</u> of <u>Whitby</u> Abbey, who died in 680. (full list further down) The Venerable Bede stated that the original ideals of monasticism were maintained strictly in Hilda's abbey. All property and goods were held in common; Christian virtues were exercised, especially <u>peace</u> and <u>charity</u>. Everyone had to study the <u>Bible</u> and do good works. Five men from this monastery later became <u>bishops</u>. Two, <u>John of Beverley</u>, Bishop of Hexham and <u>Wilfrid</u>, Bishop of York, were <u>canonized</u> for their service to the Christian church at a critical period in its fight against paganism.

After leaving Whitby we turned south again, heading for the town of Pickering, crossing the moors once again, appalled at the extent of the recent moor fires, pleased to see that the radome of Fylingdales, had not suffered damage, being quite a way from the main body of the fire.

There are other saints to be commemorated in November, and to coin a phrase "Lest we forget" the 11<sup>th</sup> of November is of course Remembrance Sunday.

The association targets the homeless and those with of low income (single families, elderly people with a low pension, young adults, etc.). The association also helps people to find housing and supports other projects.


