Although just over halfway through March, my thoughts have turned towards April. The predominant social topic for discussion among most of us has been the weather. (Very British???)

I'm sure every one of you is familiar with the saying "April showers bring May flowers", and my first thought was please no more rain! But then my second thought reminded me that we have had two years of drought restrictions because the aquifers were dry. Here in the commune of Linazay, in department 86, the Vienne, there is "ruisseau d'hiver" marked on the map. This winter stream began to flow in November last year, and is still going strong today, adjoining fields are flooded, the centre of the village has been inundated twice. This year the stream has been as much as 50 metres wide and flows from Pliboux in the Deux-Sèvres to join the river Charente near the market town of Civray. To date, there are no official figures to show how replenished the water table is, but I'm hopeful that it will not lead to any more drought restrictions this summer.

Whilst I have not been tempted to build anything as ambitious as an Ark, I was drawn to the Old Testament, in particular Genesis 6:5–7. The current situation in our world today makes sobering reading, doesn't it? There are so many areas of conflict, with more emerging daily. But we can rely on God's solemn promise, His covenant, in Genesis 9. vv9-17.

With reference to Saints' days in the month of April, two, in particular, stand out. St George, patron saint of England, commemorated on the 23rd and St. Mark the evangelist on the 25th. I'm sure we all know the tradition of St. George, but perhaps not much about St. Mark?

According to tradition, St. Mark, also called John Mark, was a cousin of St. Barnabas, an influential leader in the early Church and companion of St. Paul on his missionary journeys.

His house in Jerusalem is believed to be the site of the Last Supper, where Jesus instituted the Eucharist, and also the place where the disciples gathered after the Resurrection.

Christian tradition holds that he was a disciple of Saint Peter.

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four gospels, with only 16 chapters. It is believed to have been written around 65-70 AD.

Many scholars believe that the Gospel of Mark was the first of gospels to be written, serving as the basis for the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.

He is often represented by a winged lion, symbol of Christ's royalty and resurrection.

Saint Mark is considered the founder of the Church in Egypt, specifically the Coptic Orthodox Church. He would have been the first bishop of Alexandria, where, according to tradition, he suffered martyrdom around AD 68.

The relics of St. Mark were supposedly taken from Alexandria to Venice in 828 AD and deposited in St. Mark's Basilica, built especially to house them. He became the patron saint of Venice, and his figure is closely associated with the city's history and identity. The winged lion of Saint Mark is an iconic symbol of Venice and is found on many of the city's buildings and monuments.

St. Mark played a crucial role in the young early Church, not only as an evangelist, but also as a traveling companion to St. Paul and St. Barnabas on their missions.

I pray that you may all have a blessed Easter, Hazel.

ANNUAL MEETING (AGM) 2024

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend this years AGM on March 10th where last year was reviewed and elections took place for the positions of Churchwardens and Council members. We confirm that, as the only nominations, we were re-elected as your Churchwardens for another one-year term. The size of a Church Council is determined by the number of people on the Electoral Roll. For ASV we can have 6 Council members who serve for a 3-year term with two members retiring each year. This year Jenny Wilkinson and Geoff Kent came to the end of their 3 years but were willing to stand again. As there were no other nominations, they were elected to new 3year terms.

IMPORTANT CHANGES FOR 2025

Two important announcements were made at the AGM which need careful consideration in the next 12 months. Firstly our Chaplain, Hazel, reminded everyone that her Licence expires in the Summer of 2025. The second point is that Doug has made it quite clear that this will be his last year as Churchwarden, and he will not seek re-election at next year's AGM. At the moment, *All Saints, Vendée* is in a healthy position financially and spiritually and we hope and pray that it will continue for many years but the above points need to be addressed in the next 12 months.

Safety in a little plastic box

Whether we like it or not, or whether we admit it to ourselves, or not, we are, all of us, getting older! Some of us, whether by choice or by loss, are living on our own. Even those of us blessed to have partners may not always be in a position to help if a medical crisis situation arises. I have recently been told about an excellent free system run by the Lions Club International called Lions SOS. It seems to me a wonderful and very practical idea for us all to take up.

'LIONS SOS' involves placing written vital information relating to the person's health in a small plastic box stored in the refrigerator door. This immediately tells the emergency services about the patient's state of health and medications and can save vital time. On arrival they will see the 'LIONS SOS' sticker on the back of the front door and know that an information sheet is available in the refrigerator.

Using this system can help to bring peace of mind to the beneficiaries, elderly, isolated people, those weakened by illness, those with disabilities and others, as well as their families.

The little plastic boxes and full instructions may be collected FREE OF CHARGE from many Pharmacies across much of France, certainly in both the Vienne and Deux-Sevres

Geoff and I have already collected one each. WHAT A GREAT IDEA!

Danger ! Are we creating God in our own image ?

Are we limiting God to our own horizons? We often pretend to know what God is thinking, and we imagine that God has the same limited view of the Universe as we do, a view which has been described as the vanishingly small space around our brains.

Perhaps we should remind ourselves that our view of God is possibly as intellectually challenged as a frog's view of us.



Sometimes the best answer to a question is, « I don't know ».

Fortunately for us, we do however have the Gospels to turn to, for the guidance that God gave us through Jesus. And that still small voice inside us, Jesus telling us what the right thing to do is.

So when we hear people, ranging from world leaders and religious authorities to people around us and social media aficionadas, claiming to know what God is thinking, we have to ask ourselves whether their ideas reflect what we know from Scriptures, not always easy to understand or interpret, or is it a very personal, limited spin, reflecting their narrow, frog-eyed* view and own objectives. *(*with apologies to frogs)*

Resto du Cœur La Châtaigneraie Bulletin

Thank you all for your generous donations of food and personal hygiene products which we delivered to the Resto du Cœur La Châtaigneraie on 12th March 2024.

The La Châtaigneraie branch has 68 families on their books and can expect around 30 service users per session (they are open Tuesdays and Thursdays 14:00 – 16:00). At least 60% of their service users have children and are lone parents. Refugees include people from Syria, the Unkraine, Guinea and South America. The nearest other Restos are in Fontenay Le Comte, Chantonnay and Les Herbiers, which, as the volunteer I spoke with pointed out, is a long walk away when you've got a pushchair, no money and no car.

The La Châtaigneraie team are really proactive; the volunteers were in Super-U last week collecting food and personal hygiene donations from shoppers . They accept donations of short-dated goods from the supermarkets. They have got sachets of pet food where the boxes have split and the sachets cannot be sold individually. They even have an allotment to grow fresh veg to distribute except the wet weather has delayed lifting the potatoes and leeks.

The volunteers expressed their thanks and gratitude to the congregation of ASV. Every time we arrive with a car bootful of donations, they cheerfully pull out a battered old trolley to transport the goods and are always pleased and excited as they unpack your donations. As many of the congregation have caring and teaching experience, you understand the impact of malnutrition on the hippocampus (the centre of memory and learning in the brain). Your donations continue to protect the future of children in vulnerable families from hunger and illness.

Donations of rice, pasta, noodles, tinned meat, fish, vegetables and fruit, ready cook sauces long life milk, cream and juices, coffee, tinned and packet soups, cereals, biscuits, jam and spreads, cooking / olive oil, cat and dog food, condiments...

Loo roll, sanitary products, nappies, shampoo, bath / shower gel, washing up liquid, toothbrushes, toothpaste...
